Ultimate Protection

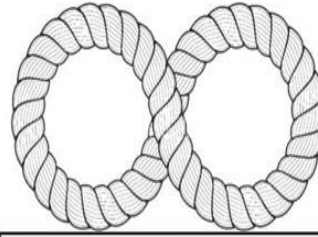


The assembled tipi hide gives the Indian families a warm shelter to live in. The tipi elements also give the ultimate protection and guidances to the Indian people.

Control Flaps



The rope and/or cord that tie the tipi poles together show a good Indian Nation for we are one. The Indian Nation that is working together provides a good, strong, and everlasting relationship.

The control flaps on a tipi teach that we are all connected by relationship and that we depend on each other. Having respect for and understanding this connection creates and controls harmony and balance in the circle of life. When we don't know how to use the flaps, it gets all smoky inside the tipi, and you can't see, which is like life - because if we can't live in balance, we can't see clearly where we are going. ~ Elder Mary Lee

Vern & Bob Walk 100 000

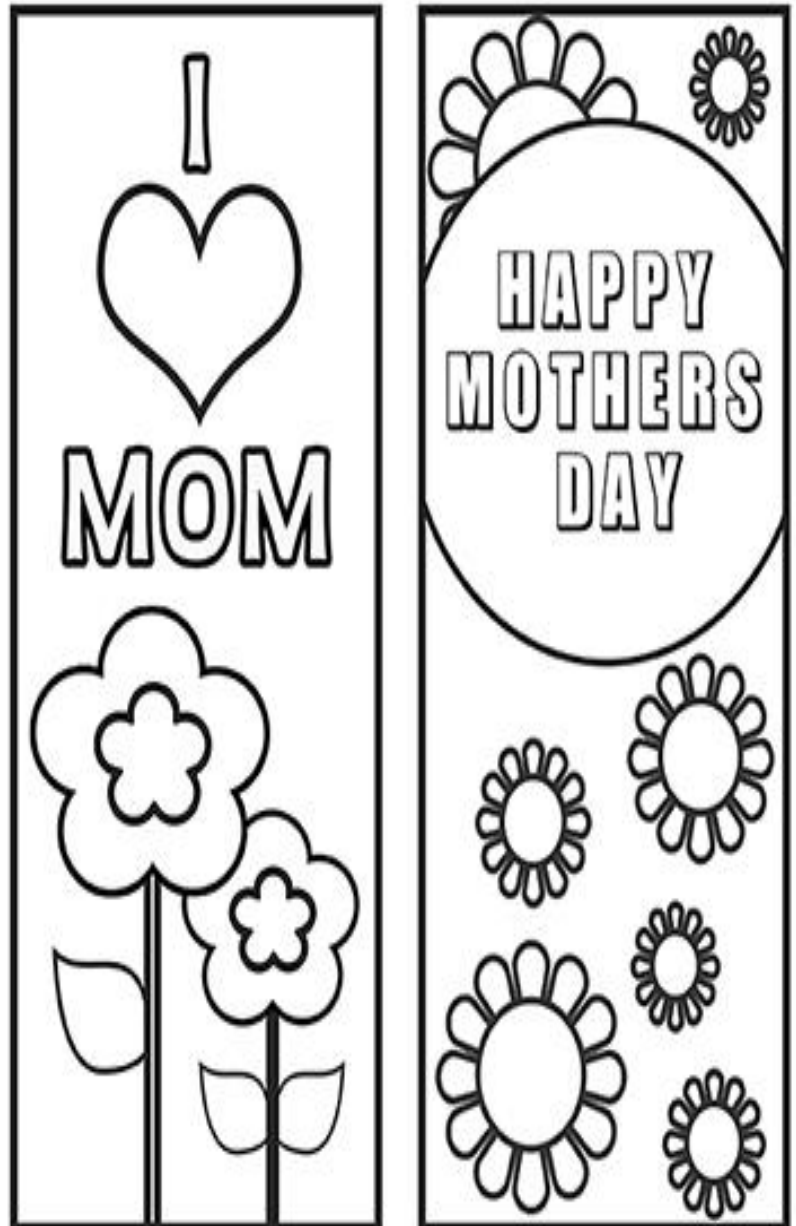

ê-kîmwêcik, ê-âtotahkik ôma kihci-askiy.

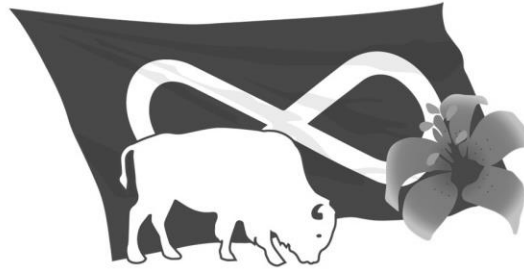
